Kathleen Lowney, PhD, is Professor of Sociology at Valdosta State University and author of *In the Trenches: Teaching and Learning in Sociology*, forthcoming with W. W. Norton. Throughout her career she has taught social problems, mass media and popular culture, sociology of religion, domestic violence, sociology of disability, religion and culture, introduction to applied sociology, and for the last five years, she has specialized in large sections of introduction to sociology. She has written about gender roles in

the Unification Church, kudzu as a social problem, adolescent Satanism, stalking as a new crime problem, mass media constructions of social problems, and recently, how the media constructs nurses who are serial killers.

She has been active in the teaching movement in the discipline of sociology since 1992. She has published nearly thirty manuscripts on the scholarship of teaching and learning and in 2009 became the editor of *Teaching Sociology*. In 2014, she was honored with the ASA's 2014 Award for Distinguished Contributions to Teaching. Helping students to engage their sociological imagination is her passion.



Mindy Stombler, PhD, is a senior lecturer in sociology at Georgia State University. She currently teaches undergraduate mass sections of social problems and sexuality and society. She also created and continues to run the Graduate Teacher Training Program in the Department of Sociology. She was a recipient of her college's Outstanding Teaching Award. Her research has focused on the production of sexual collective identities. For example, she explored how men in gay fraternities

negotiated their dual identities of being gay and being Greek and how men in gay fraternities reproduced hegemonic masculinity. Her current research focuses on power relations and oral sex as well as a variety of pedagogical issues. She is co-editor of *Sex Matters: The Sexuality and Society Reader* now in its Fourth Edition with W. W. Norton, and is co-author of *Focus on Social Problems: A Contemporary Reader*, forthcoming with Oxford University Press. More information is available at MINDYSTOMBLER.COM.
